Where do you start ?

To Determine How the New Rural Plan Will Affect Your Property...

Find your property on the Zone Map

- Identify the zone category or categories
- Find the poster that highlights that Zone(s)
- Look at the list of permitted uses
- Determine if there are any special requirements specific to a permitted use
- Check out the definitions for each of the permitted uses
- Review the development standards for each of the permitted uses
- Check the Section 5.0 for the General Provisions that apply to your situation
- Do not forget to consider how the Rural Plan addresses land uses in your community as well



If you are looking to develop your property and you still have questions (general or specific), feel free to speak to Planning Commission Staff.

Submit written comments regarding the Proposed Kennebecasis Rural Plan to Royal District Planning Commission

Written Submissions will be accepted until 4:30 on **November 16, 2007**

Planning Commission Staff will consider all submission and make appropriate changes to the Rural Plan.

Following revisions to the proposed Rural Plan, a **Public Hearing** will be held.

Comments (both written and verbal) made at the Public Hearing will be forwarded to the Minister of Environment and the Minister will consider these comments before approving the Rural Plan
