

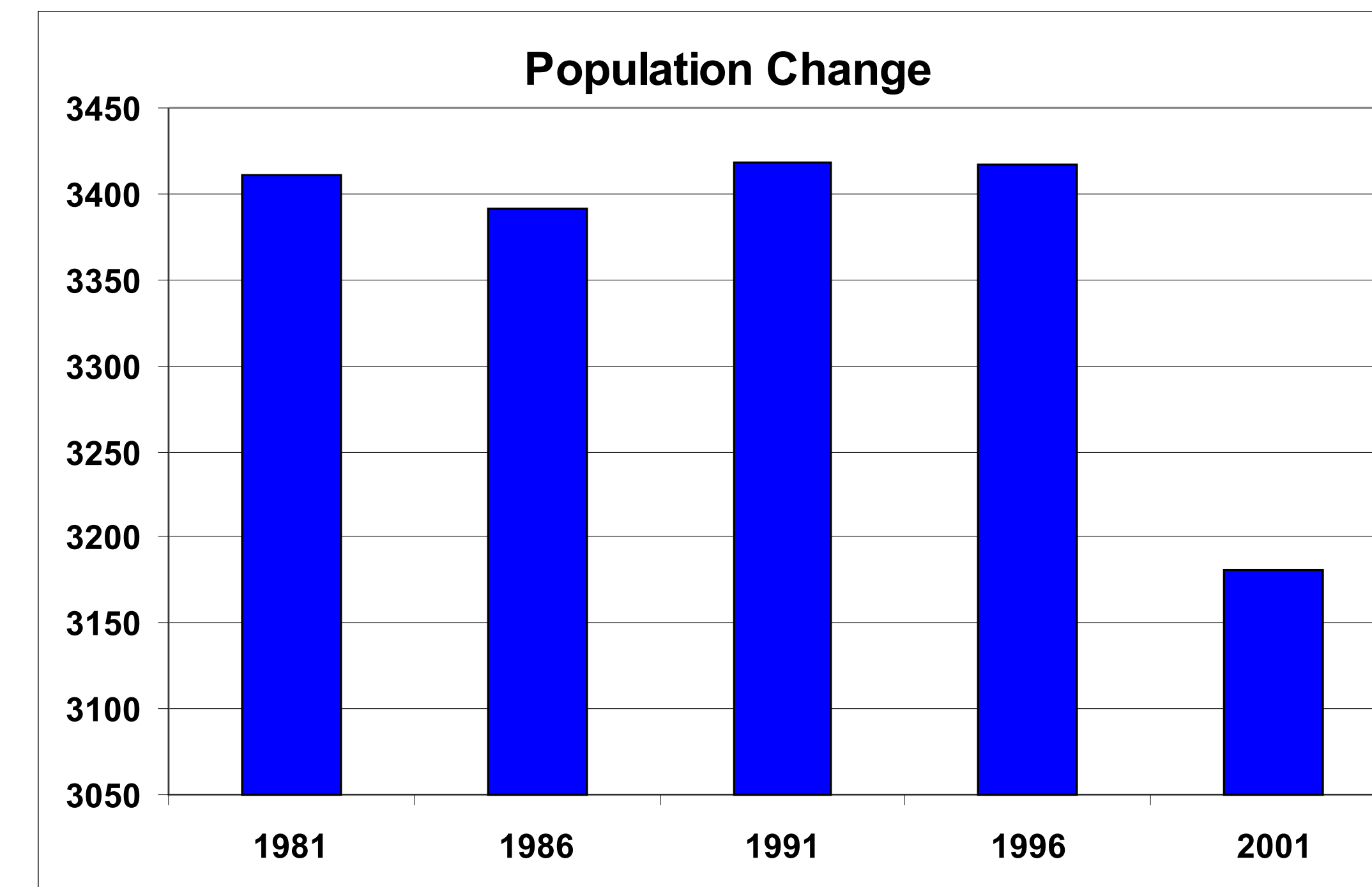

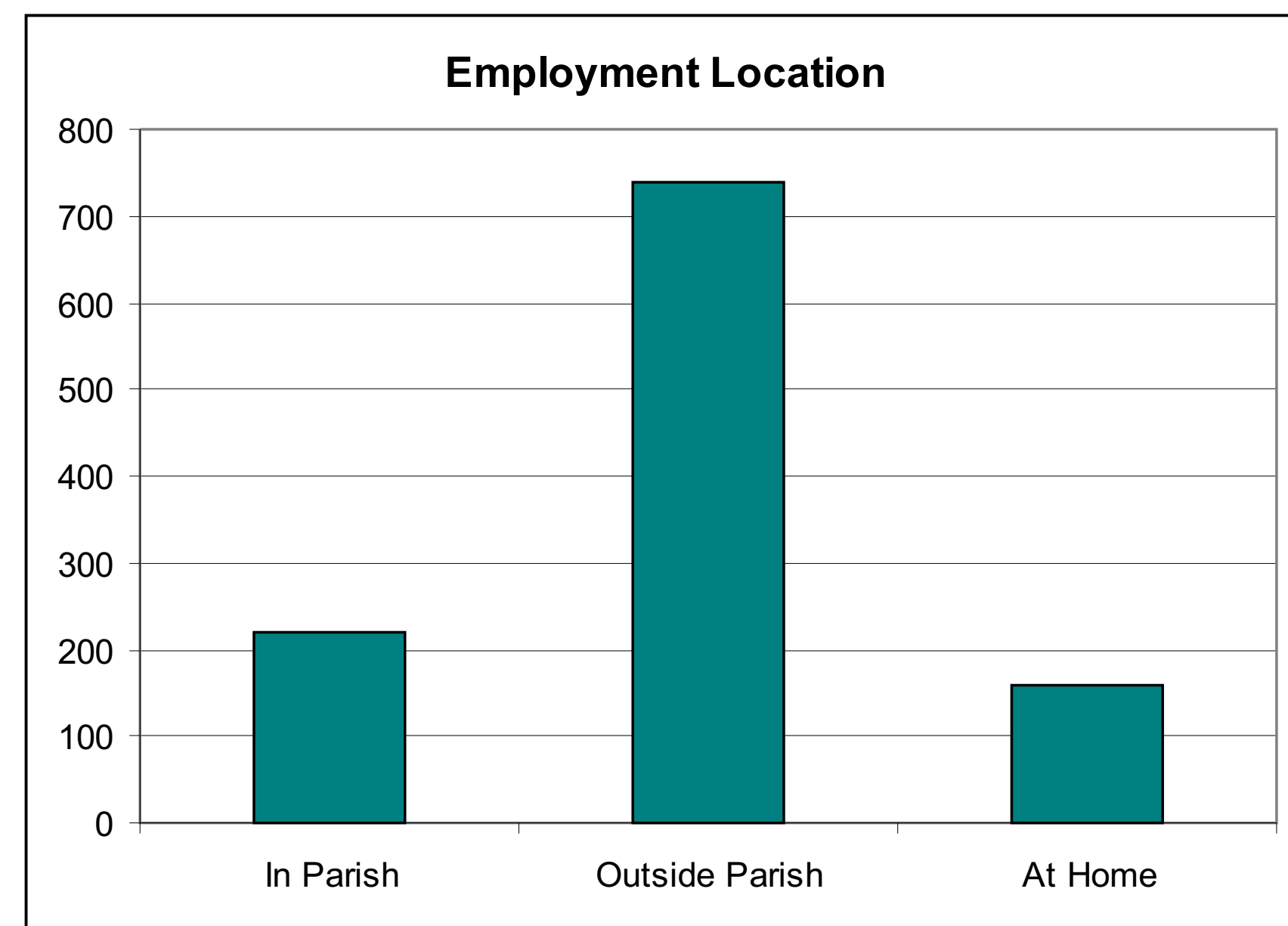

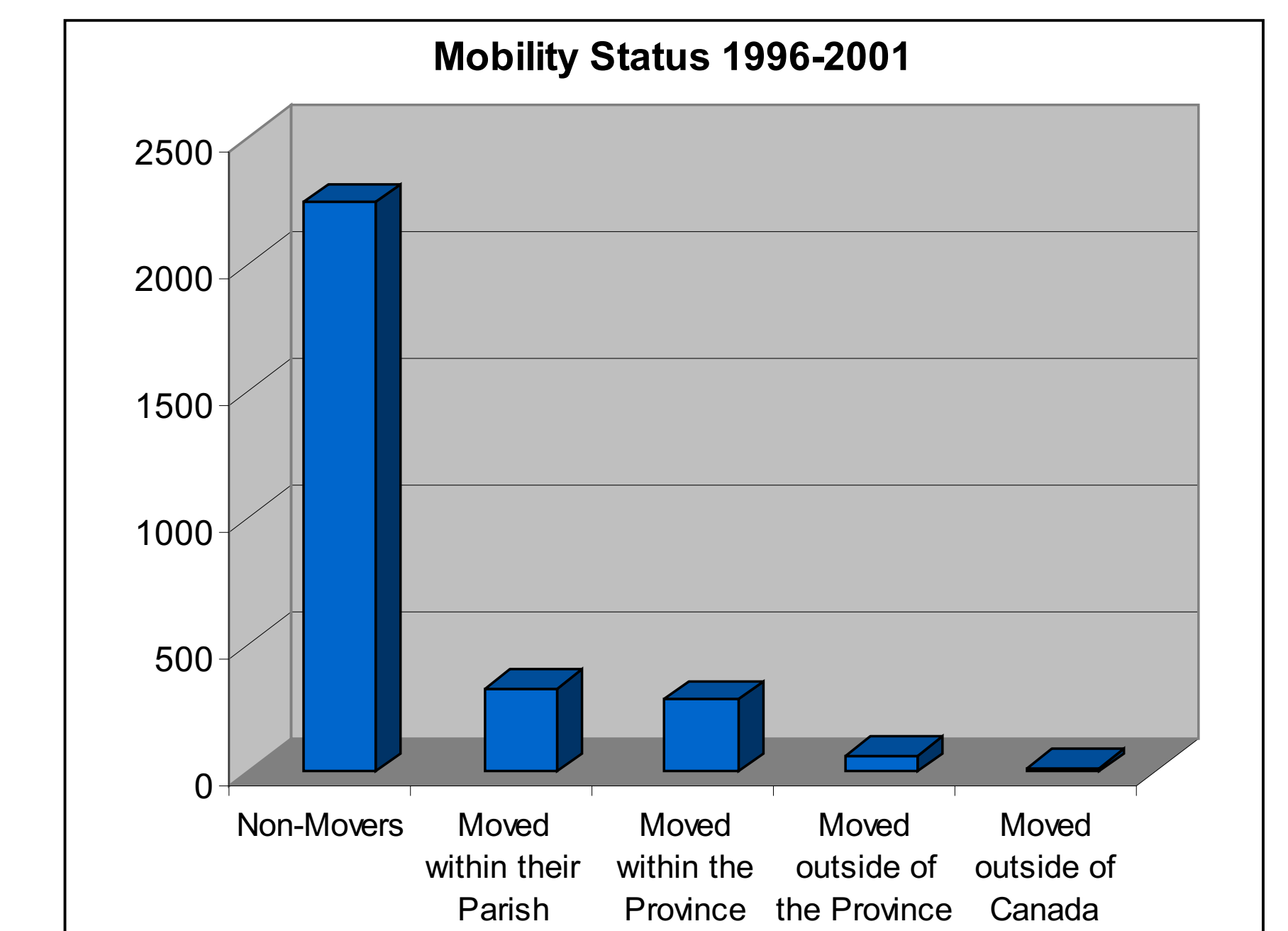
Employment Location



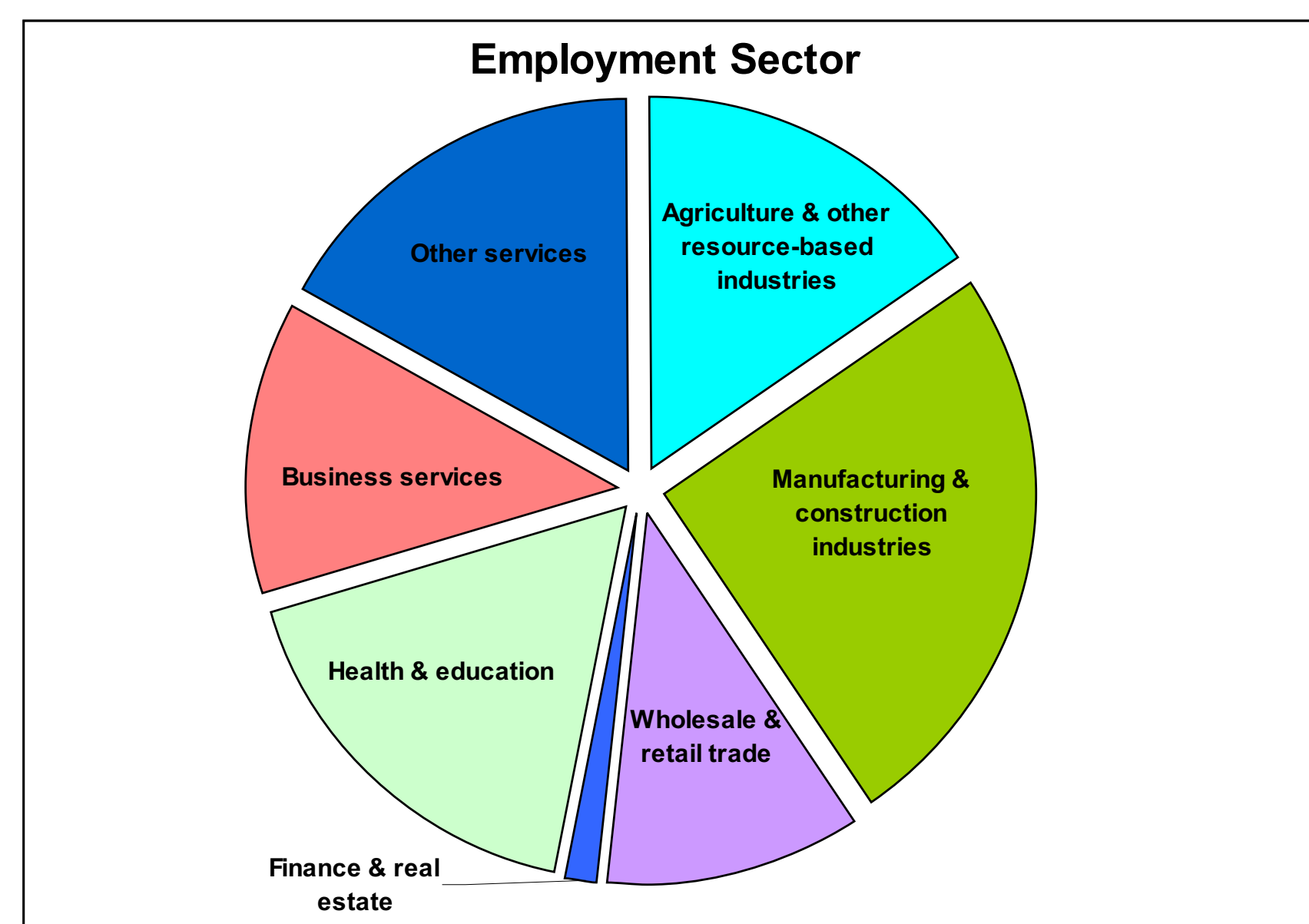
The majority of the residents in the Saint John Tributaries Planning Area are employed outside of their Parish.

The five year mobility statistics indicates 25% of the residents living in the Saint John Tributaries Planning Area have moved between the years 1996-2001. However, of the total 700 residents who moved, 330 moved within their Parish.



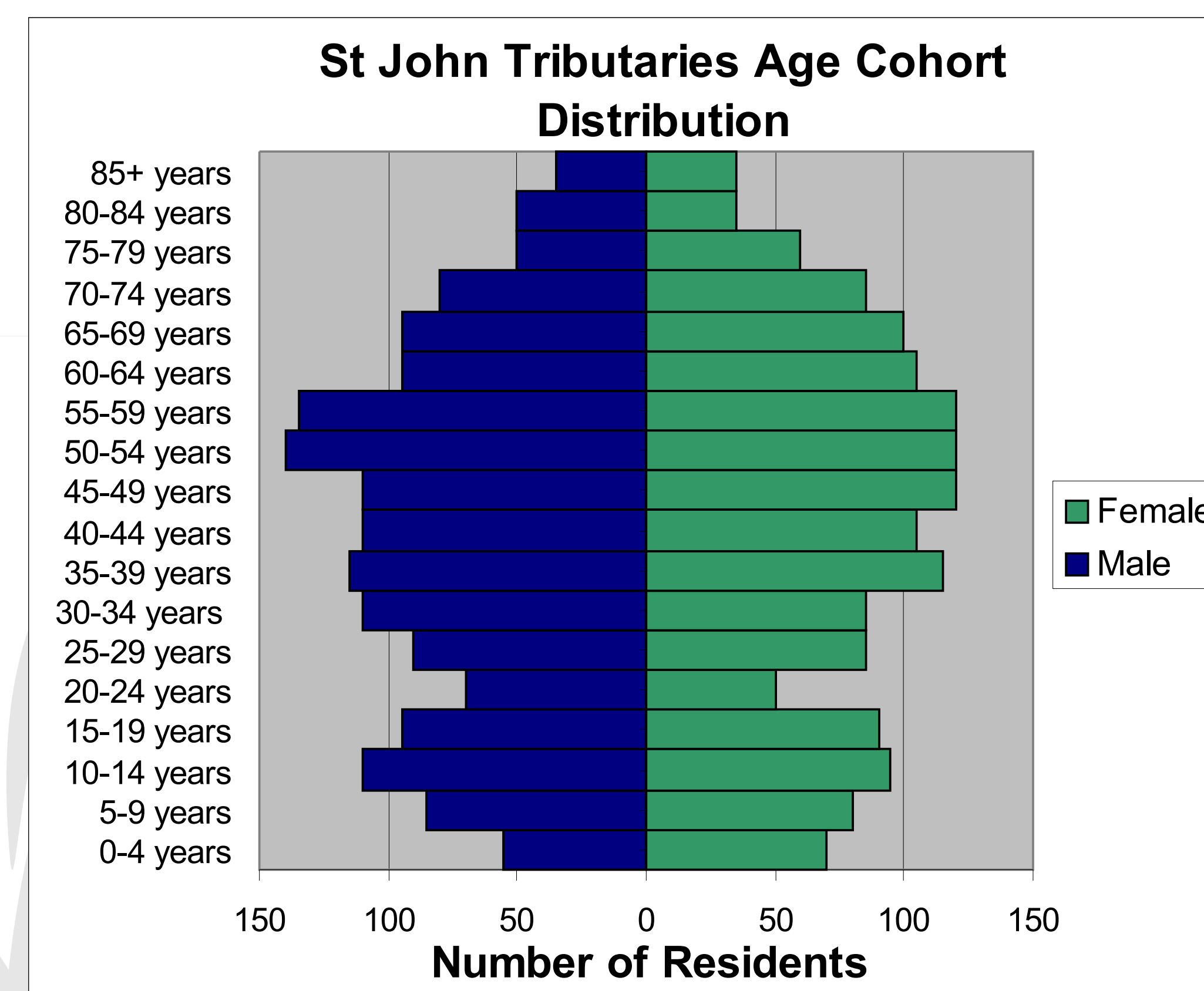
Employment Sectors



The largest employment sectors are associated with Manufacturing and Construction and Agriculture and Primary Resource industries.

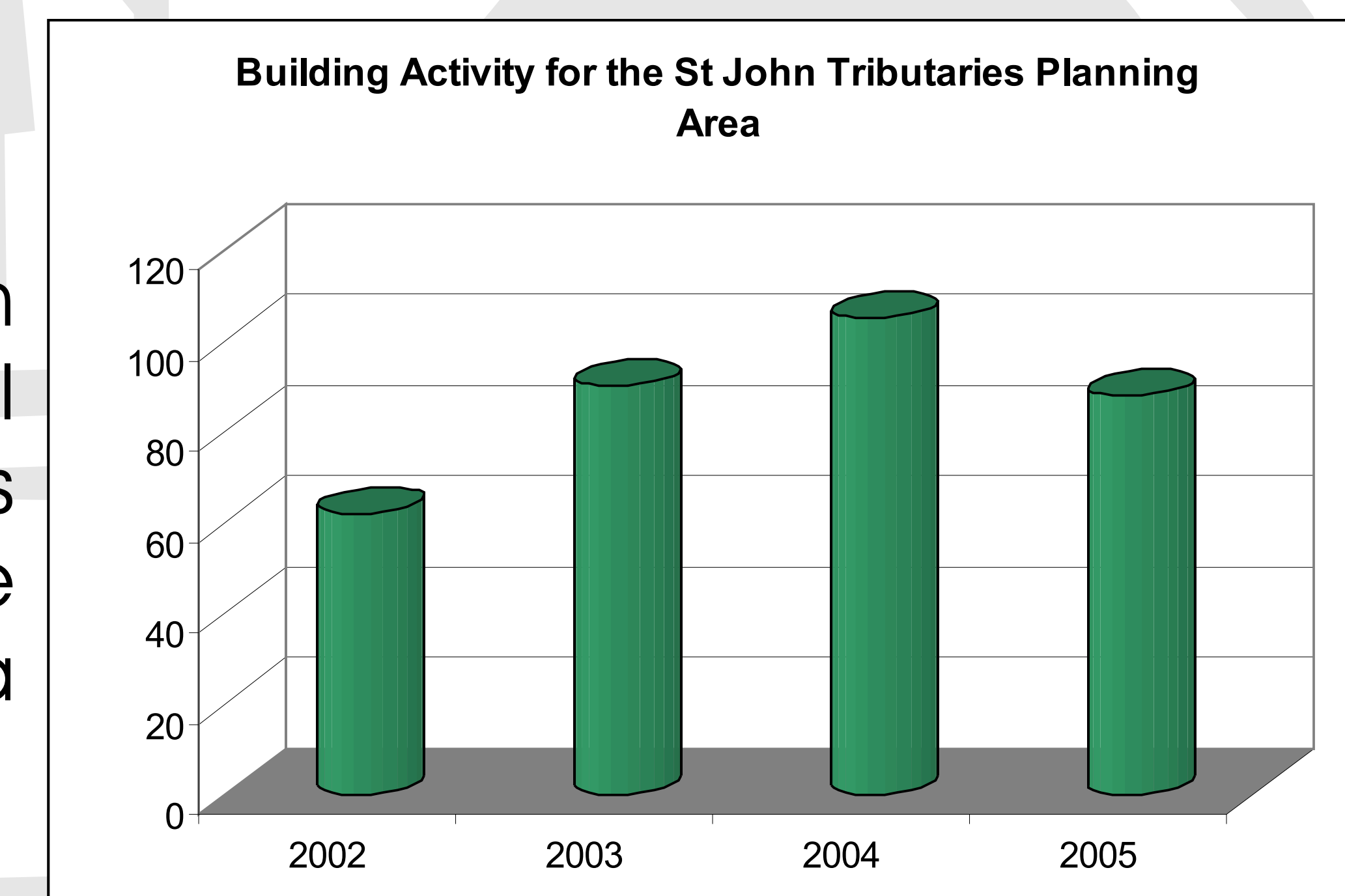
Age Distribution

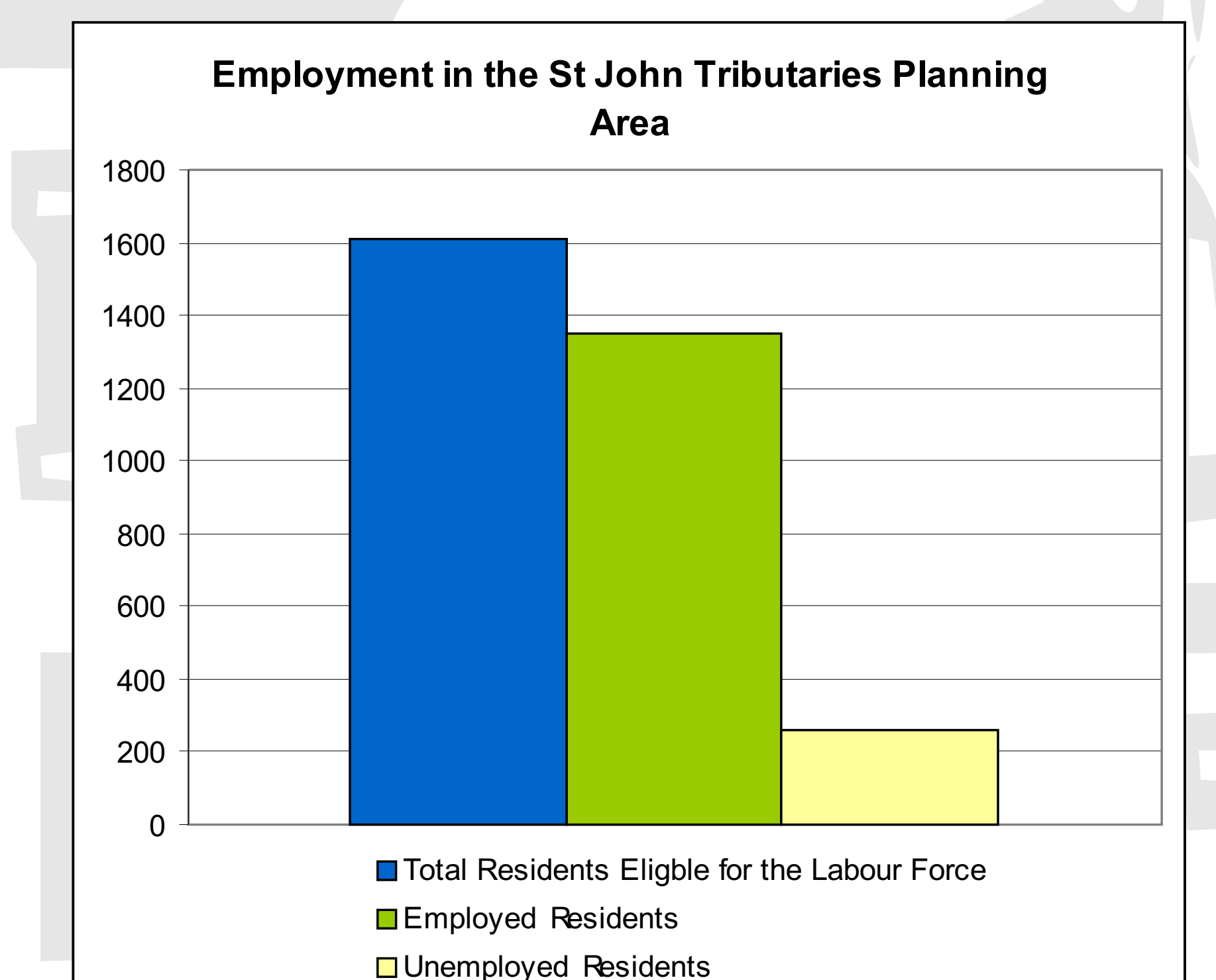


Building Statistics

The Royal District Planning Commission has only required building permits for all construction in unincorporated areas since 2002. There has been an increase in building activity since 2002, with a peak in 2004.
