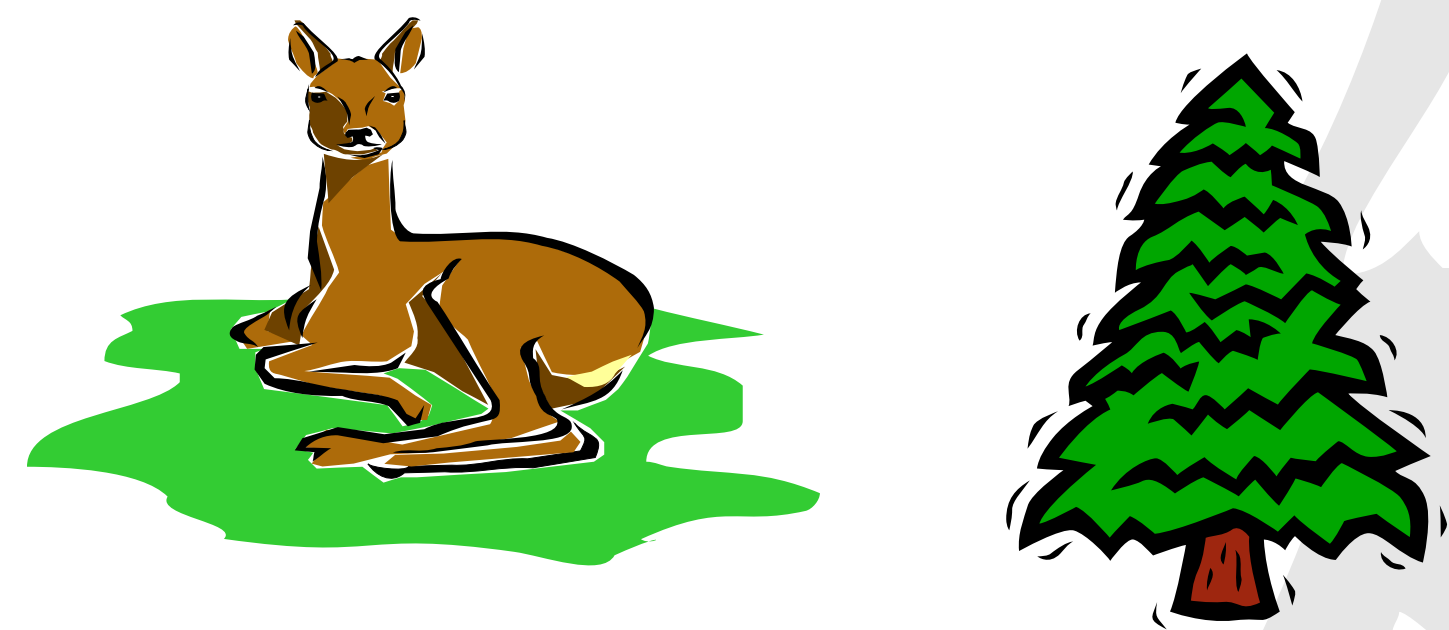


Woodland

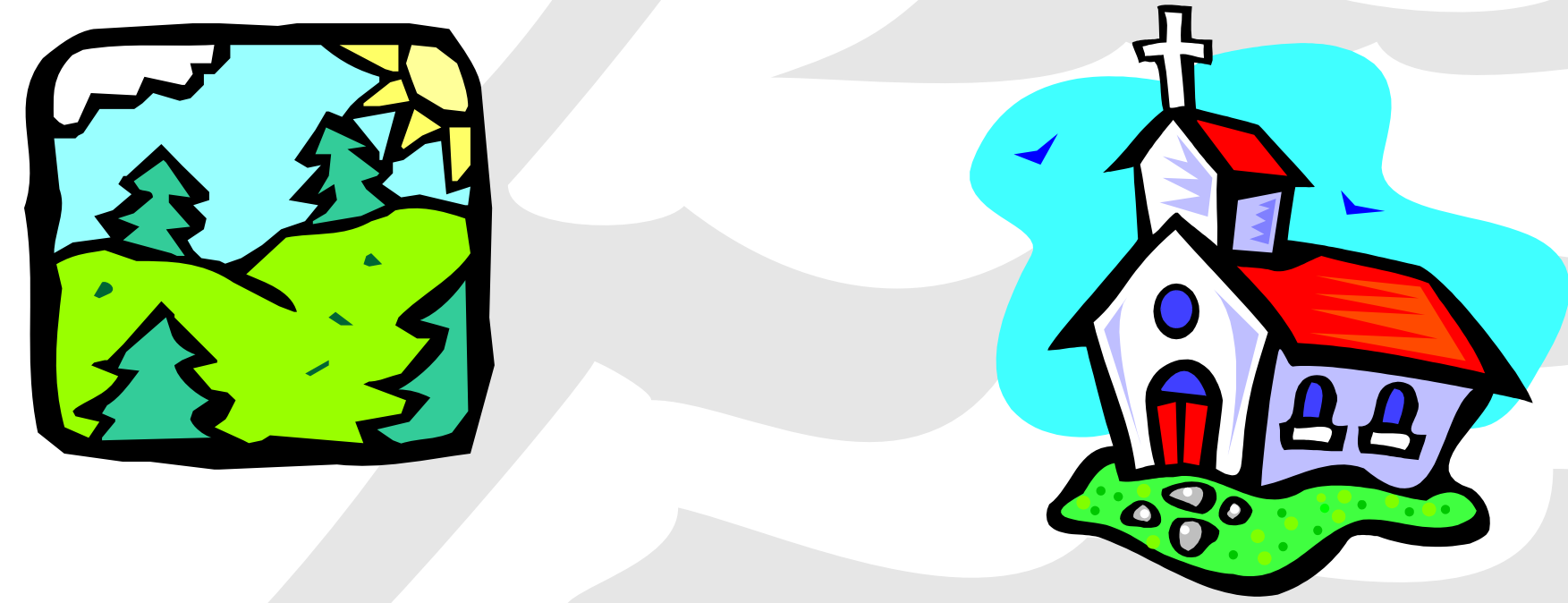
Land assessed as Woodland comprises the largest land use in the Planning Area at 82.2%.

Land assessed as woodland includes Crown Land, industrial holdings and private holdings.



Residential

Residential is another large land consumer, due in part to the fact that there are a large number of residential properties with large lot sizes.

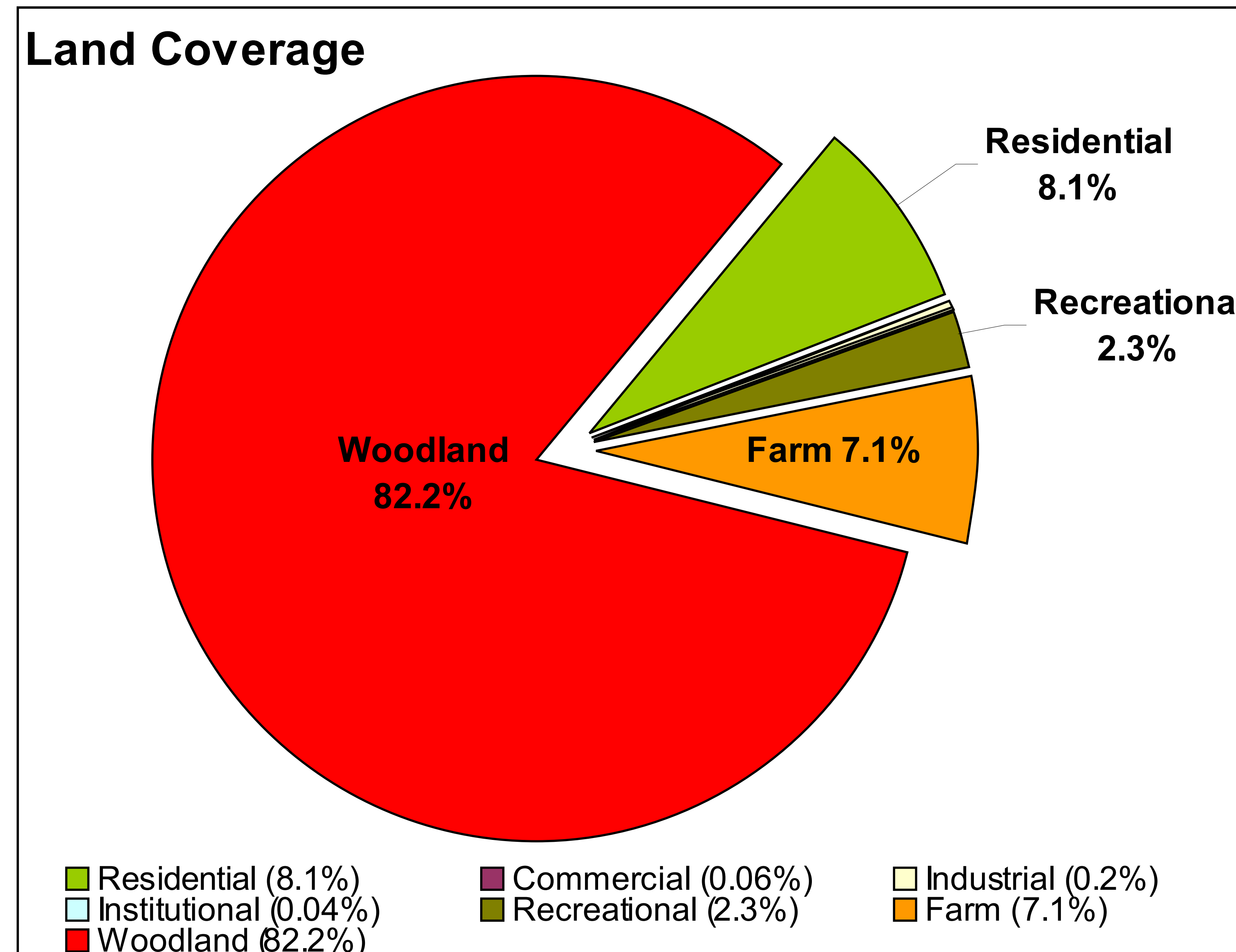


Institutional

Institutional land occupies the smallest amount of land in the Planning Area at 100 hectares.

Land Use

The chart below shows land use area coverage as assessed by Service New Brunswick.



Recreational

There are 5381 hectares assessed as recreational in the Planning Area. This consists of 2.3% of the land base of the Planning Area.

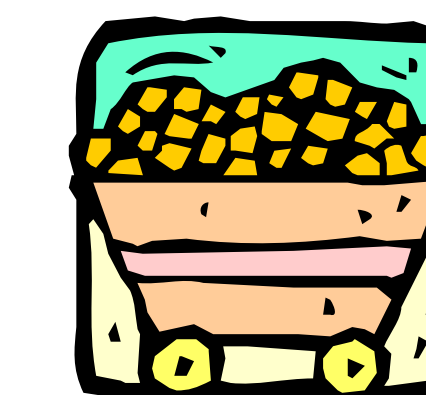
Many of the recreational properties are situated on Saint John River, Grand Lake and Belleisle Bay.



There are 423.8 hectares assessed as industrial property in the Planning Area.

These properties include gravel pits, quarries, warehouses, and utility operations.

Agriculture

Agriculture has the third largest land coverage in the Planning Area. Agricultural land covers 7.1% of the land in the Planning Area.

These include livestock and pasture properties and mixed type farm properties.



Commercial

There are not many commercial establishments in the Planning Area.

There are 140.3 hectares assessed as commercial property in the Planning Area. These properties can include such uses as neighborhood convenience stores, gas stations, and take-outs.
